Storage	Store lyophilized material at 2-8°C. For long time storage after reconstitution, dilute the antibody solution with glycerol to a final concentration of 50% glycerol and store as liquid at -20°C, to prevent loss of enzymatic activity. For example, if you have reconstituted 1 mg of antibody in 1.1 ml of sterile water add 1.1 ml of glycerol. Such solution will not freeze in -20°C. If you are using a 1:5000 dilution prior to diluting with glycerol, then you would need to use a 1:2500 dilution after adding glycerol. Prepare working dilution prior to use and then discard. Be sure to mix well but without foaming.

Application Notes	Additional Information: No reactivity is observed to non-immunoglobulin guinea pig serum proteins. No reactivity is observed to serum from bovine, hen, goat, hamster, horse, human, mouse, rabbit, rat or sheep based on immunoelectrophoresis. HRP-conjugate is supplied in 10 mM Sodium Phosphate, 0.15 M Sodium Chloride, pH 7.2, 10 % (w/v) BSA, Protease/IgG free 0.1 % (v/v) of Kathon CG is used as preservative. Background: Goat anti-guinea pig IgG is a secondary antibody conjugated to HRP which binds to all guinea pig IgGs in immunological assays. Reconstitution: For reconstitution add 1.1 ml of sterile water. Let it stand 30 minutes at room temperature to dissolve. Prepare fresh working dilutions daily.
